Yesterday I reported the great news that we received verification from the District that all of our PCAs and our **Full-Time Salaried Substitutes** would continue to be paid during this time off. I did fail to include our **Adjuncts** in yesterday's list—but that had been decided and shared earlier —so I thought that was already well known and well-shared. **All of this is great news!** 

However, we are still dumfounded by the fact that the District is standing firm on NOT paying our day-to-day subs! The Superintendent did ask us to submit our plan in writing to the District Leadership Team (once again), but we have still heard nothing back from them.

Remember, this is the same District who claims that they so desperately want to increase the numbers of our substitute teachers. This is the same District who so fastidiously keeps all of the data on how much learning is lost by our students when our teachers get sick and the District is unable to fill a sub position! This is the same District that laments the low substitute fill rates in our staffing support schools and blames teachers for taking off, rather than looking toward their antiquated and painfully slow hiring and staffing procedures. This is the same District who does not treat their full-time staff with respect and treats our hard working day-to-day substitutes with even less.

You would think a District that wants to attract and hold substitutes, a District that wants to be the district that substitute teachers want to flock to, would be picking up the mantle in this difficult time and saying, "We value our Substitute Teachers and the remarkable service that they provide for our students and our District each and every day! We will thank them for their help and loyalty and help them weather this crisis like we are doing for some of our highest salaried employees."
