The 2020 Census & COVID-19 Are Not Mutually Exclusive.

As one of the key components of determining Federal funding for the entire nation, the 2020 Census is now inexorably intertwined with the current (and future) challenges of the coronavirus pandemic.


The reason is simple—we can reasonably assume COVID-19 is here to stay well beyond the confines of this year. For the Federal government to have an accurate representation of every person living in America (and where they live), the Census is the counting tool that sets the baseline of resource allocation for the next 10 years.

The nation currently sits at a only a 63% Census response rate, and with door-to-door visitations made even more complicated in the age of COVID-19, the threat of yet another undercount of black and brown residents—as well as undocumented residents—is looming even larger this year.

What's more, the deadline for the collection of Census information may have just been moved up one month—from October 31st to September 30th.

FULL Census Participation Means Proper Education Funding, Infrastructure Investment, Accurate Representation and More.

With Pennsylvania facing a potential multi-billion dollar state budget shortfall, the 2020 Census is now even more critical to the well being of all Pennsylvanians. The entire nation will be competing for Federal dollars—funding, resources and representation that is proportionally allocated using Census figures.

Every person living here must be counted to make a measurable difference when it comes to **education funding**, infrastructure and human services allocations, and accurate, fair congressional representation.

Responses on a mail-in, on-line, or in-person Census form are COMPLETELY confidential and protected by U.S. law. **This is about accurately counting people—plain and simple—not citizenship status!**
