It's been almost impossible to not make comparative leaps between how the Covid-19 first began to take hold and the slow emergence of Monkeypox as a potential viral threat to the world.

However, there is little comparison to be made at this juncture – primarily because the scientific community was (*is*) already familiar with Monkeypox as a virus. And though the spread globally is cause for concern (*16,000 cases and climbing*), we are at an early stage of what is being described as a "*public health emergency of worldwide concern*" by the World Health Organization.
